


BAYCLIFF ADULT HOLIDAY PARTY 2006



City of Virginia Beach Redesigns Its Website: VBgov.com

On December 5, 2006, the City of Virginia Beach unveiled the new, improved and simplified design for the city's official government Web site, VBgov.com. The new site was designed with citizens in mind, and its main focus is as a **true "Citizen Service Portal"**. **New features on the redesigned site include real-time local weather conditions, improved search capabilities powered by Google™ and expanded self-service capabilities for many city services such as payment of city bills, online registration for Parks and Recreation Department classes and online access to Police incident reports.** The VBgov.com redesign continues a strong initiative to improve the City's customer service offerings. **In addition to the City's recently implemented 311 service and popular online assistance service, the new site provides an opportunity to conduct City business through ease of use and 24-hour access to the City's most commonly requested services and information.** Gwen K. IDENTITY THEFT SCAM ALERT: TELEPHONE FRAUD INVOLVING JURY DUTY

(This information was taken from a 1/5/07 bayciffwatch message reporting an FBI-Press Release)

Washington, D.C. - The FBI today is providing a warning to the public against an ongoing scheme involving jury service. The public needs to be aware that individuals identifying themselves as U.S. court employees have been telephonically contacting citizens and advising them that they have been selected for jury duty. These individuals ask to verify names and Social Security numbers, then ask for credit card numbers. If the request is refused, citizens are then threatened with fines. The judicial system does not contact people telephonically and ask for personal information such as your Social Security number, date of birth or credit card numbers. If you receive one of these phone calls, do not provide any personal or confidential information to these individuals. This is an attempt to steal or to use your identity by obtaining your name, Social Security number and potentially to apply for credit or credit cards or other loans in your name. It is an attempt to defraud you. If you have already been contacted and have already given out your personal information, please monitor your account statements and credit reports, and contact your local FBI office. Local FBI field office telephone numbers can be found in the front of your local telephone directory or on www.fbi.gov. Baycliff Webmaster Bill Westendorf has created a **Neighborhood E-Mail Alert System** to promote increased communication, awareness and safety among the residents of Baycliff. This group emailing system complements our existing Neighborhood Watch system and our Baycliff Bugle newsletter.

Our Baycliffwatch delivers security and emergency information, as well as community and civic league announcements, to residents quickly. Similar e-mail neighborhood watches in other neighborhoods have been very successful in reducing crime and in keeping residents informed and connected regarding community news and emergency situations.

To participate in Baycliffwatch, you must first register. To enroll, go to the Baycliff Website at: www.baycliff.net and click on the **Crime Dog / "Baycliff E-Watch" icon**. Click "Join E-Watch," and your e-mail program will open with a new e-mail message with the proper "Send To" address already filled in. You don't need to enter anything in the message; just click the "Send" button.



In a few minutes, you'll get an e-mail message asking you to confirm your registration. We use an automated bulletin board system supplied by Yahoo Groups to maintain the mailing list and to distribute messages. Once you register for Baycliffwatch, you will receive a message from Yahoo Groups to confirm that you want to join the Baycliff E-Watch group. Just follow the instructions in the e-mail to complete your registration.

WATCH OUT FOR PESTY ROOF RATS

Roof rats in our area were first reported in the Alanton community two years ago, recently entering Baycliff. With the onset of colder weather, we have had increasing reports of ROOF RATS in Baycliff attics.

An exterminating company recently trapped and removed a number of roof rats from a Baycliff resident's attic. With the arrival of winter and animals seeking a warm home, it is possible that more Baycliff homes may become invaded. **Here is what you need to know.**

Roof Rats are reddish brown (or blackish brown) medium-sized, slender rats with long, naked, scaly tails. The Roof Rat is smaller than the Norway Rat and less aggressive. Adult Roof Rats weigh about 5 - 9 ounces and are 7-10 inches long. The tail is longer than the head and body combined. They have large ears and a pointed nose. The fur is smooth, as opposed to the Norway rat with its shaggy fur. **Roof rats present a health hazard.** Like the Norway rat, the roof rat is destructive to foodstuffs and property. They chew electrical wiring, leave nasty fecal droppings and stockpile food which often rots and decays. Roof rats also play an important part in the transmission of such human diseases as endemic typhus, ratbite fever, and bubonic plague.

Distribution: Roof rats range along the lower half of the East Coast and throughout the Gulf States and upward into Arkansas. They also exist along the Pacific Coast and are found on the Hawaiian Islands. The roof rat is apparently not quite as adaptable as the Norway rat, which is one reason it has not spread throughout the country. **Diet:** The food habits of roof rats resemble those of tree squirrels, since they both like a wide variety of fruit, nuts and seeds. If you hear scampering on your roof, it may be Roof Rats, not squirrels. They also feed on a variety of ornamental and native plant materials. Like the Norway rat, they are omnivorous and will feed on most anything if necessary. **While they prefer grains, seeds, nuts, fresh vegetables and fruits, they will eat meat and almost any food with nutritive value.** **Habits:** The Roof Rat is a climber, commonly nesting above the ground, in trees, vines, attics, rafters, ceiling voids, or in voids along the roof line. These rats enter homes much like squirrels. As their population grows, they will nest in underground burrows.

Rats see poorly, relying more on smell, taste, touch and hearing. They are considered to be colorblind, responding only to the degree of lightness and darkness of colors. Roof rats also have an excellent sense of balance. They use their tails for balance while traveling along overhead utility lines/tree branches and are very agile climbers.

Roof rats are nocturnal and usually begin searching for food shortly after sunset. If the food is in an exposed area and too large to be eaten quickly, yet not too large to be moved, they will usually carry it to a hiding place before eating it. Many rats will cache or hoard considerable amounts of solid food, which they may or may not eat later. When necessary, roof rats will travel considerable distances for food. They can often be seen at night running along overhead utility lines. (While Baycliff has underground utility lines, we have a super-

Reproduction: Roof rats breed throughout the year, with two peaks of breeding in the late fall and spring. Born in a nest about 21 days after conception, the young rats are naked. The 5 to 8 young in the litter develop quickly, growing hair within a week. They mature rather rapidly, are weaned when about 3 weeks old, and are able to reproduce when approximately 3 months old. As you can see, there can be a very rapid population explosion of Roof Rats.

Roof Rat Elimination: Although spring traps (snap traps,) glue boards and live traps will work when eliminating Roof rat populations, the most effective control for this small rat is with the combination of glue traps and weather proof bait blocks. Openings into attics and roofs must also be secured by screening so that new Roof Rats cannot enter. Cats and high frequency noise devices have not been effective in controlling Roof Rat populations.


