DREDGING COMMITTEE REQUEST TO EXPLORE SELLING EASEMENTS

The Baycliff Civic League has established that it owns a strip of land on the boating canal's western side, which extends from the boat ramp along the canal up to Hidden Cove. We have recorded city maps, a deed, a title search, and historical letters documenting this. It is why you see docks built on the other side that stop short of deep water access. Their property abuts a tidal mud flat or extremely low water. It's only at high tide that they can they reach the water, and they must use small, low draft boats or kayaks.

We are working hard to restore the Baycliff Boating Canal to a fully navigable condition at all tides and need to raise additional funds to pay for the dredging project. It has been suggested that the Dredging Committee explore the possibility of selling conditional easements to these individuals to raise more funds. Purchasing these easements would allow homeowners on the opposite side of the water to dredge out their channel, at their own expense, and to tie into our channel, providing them deeper water access, adding value to their homes and allowing them to have larger boats. Land adjoining the western side of the canal will continue to be developed, and new piers have already been and will continue to be built. We would be wise to work together with our neighbors on the other side of the canal and maximize benefit to our community.

On September 15, 2010, a motion was presented at a Civic League Meeting and passed that states, "The Baycliff Civic League will not consider or accept any proposal to build any pier or other structure to access Mill Dam Creek from any location across the creek from this time forth."

The Dredging Committee would like to rescind this action to allow Dredging Committee members the opportunity to explore if selling easements is beneficial and feasible. **WE ARE NOT VOTING ON WHETHER OR NOT TO SELL EASEMENTS NOW, only on whether or not to rescind this previous action.** This vote only enables the dredging committee to research whether selling easements is possible and advantageous. Committee findings and recommendations will be distributed community-wide via Baycliffwatch and the Baycliff Bugle. Should selling easements be a viable option, then Baycliff residents will then be asked to vote to approve or disapprove.

Absentee Ballot

Should you be unable to attend the September 16th BAYCLIFF CIVIC LEAGUE meeting, please take the time to complete and return this ballot so that we have adequate votes to approve or disapprove this proposal. **We are deciding whether or not to rescind the following motion, which was passed on September 15, 2010. It states, "The Baycliff Civic League will not consider or accept any proposal to build any pier or other structure to access Mill Dam Creek from any location across the creek from this time forth."**

This is not a vote to sell easements to access the canal to residents on the other side. We await a full report from the Dredging Committee on the results of their investigation and recommendations, which will be printed in the Baycliff Bugle and distributed on Baycliffwatch. Should the Dredging Committee recommend action, there will be discussion and a vote on their proposal at a general membership meeting. **Please deliver ballots to Recording Secretary Lisa Rosenfeld, 1556 Seafarer Lane, before noon on Wednesday, September 16th.** If you need additional ballots, please photocopy. All ballots must be hand signed. Mark one circle to cast your vote.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT BAYCLIFF DREDGING





- Q Why are we dredging the Baycliff boating canal?
- A It has been 47 years since our channel was dredged, and a large amount of sediment has built up, reducing both the canal's depth and width and making navigation difficult, particularly at low tide.
- Q Why should a non-boater contribute to dredging or care about this?
- A Baycliff is a waterfront community with all 278 homes having deep water access. This boosts the real estate value of all homes. Non-waterfront homes have access through our community boat ramp and canal. To ensure Baycliff's future as a desirable waterfront community, **it's critical that we now do maintenance dredging to restore our canal to a fully navigable condition at all tides.**
- Q How much do we expect dredging will cost?
- A Current estimate is \$190,000.
- Q When is the target date to dredge?
- A Target time frame is January/February 2017.
- Q Why does it take so long?
- A We have hired Marine Engineering to create the channel design and site plan which takes 60-90 Days. Then we apply for permitting and approval, which is about a 6-12 month process.
- Q How much are we paying Marine Engineering?
- A \$10,135, plus there are additional fees (multiple agency reviews, notices, hearing fees, permits) that need to be paid to the city and other agencies that total approximately \$2500.
- Q Who decided this, and how are we paying for these fees?
- A On 11/2/ 2013, the community voted for the transfer of \$20,000 from Baycliff's Capital Improvements bank account into a separate account designated for dredging. On 1/21/2015, the community voted for a hydrographic survey of the canal. After soliciting and reviewing four estimates, the Dredging Committee selected Marine Engineering to conduct the survey for \$6000. This survey was completed this spring. \$14,000 of the civic league "seed money" remains to pay for the channel design, site plan, and permit process.
- Q Once the permits are approved how long will the dredging process take?
- A It will take 4 to 6 weeks, depending on the weather.
- Q Why do you need our pledge money now if dredging does not start until January/February 2017?
- A We cannot hire a dredging company on promised funds. Our banked funds demonstrate to dredging firms entering into a contract with us that we have adequate financial support to pay them.

- Q How much have Baycliff residents pledged so far to support dredging?
 A Residents have now pledged over \$154,000 to help restore our waterway, enough to do a limited version of our proposed dredging plan. However, half of Baycliff residents have given nothing, and we still need and ask for everyone's support. **No donation is too small!**
- Q So it's correct that we are short of our fund raising goals on Pledge to Dredge?
 A Yes, right now we are about \$36,000 short of our goal. However, the Dredging Committee is exploring other means of funding, and there are residents that have stated they will contribute more if necessary. We may need to alter our plan to fit the funding.
- Q How can you alter the plan to fit the funding?
 A We can make changes to the channel width, such as going from a 25-foot-wide channel to a 20-foot wide channel and still maintain the 4-foot-depth. We may need to cut back on areas dredged.
- Q Is a 20-foot-wide channel wide enough for two boats to pass?
 A Yes, although the channel will be 20-foot-wide, it is not square cut. There will still be sloped depth on either side of the channel.
- Q Will dredging damage my bulk head or dock, and will I still be able to use my dock?
 A The channel will be at least 10 feet off any bulk heads to prevent collapse and a minimum of 10 feet away from docks and lifts.
- Q Are we still using the boat ramp area as a spoils transfer site?
 A Yes, this is one of the advantages that we can provide a dredging company. By offering the use of our boat ramp, we get a lower cost per cubic yard of silt and sediment to be removed.
- Q What happens to the pledges if we do not dredge?
 A All dredging pledges are in a separate account dedicated to dredging at PNC bank and will only be spent for dredging. Should we not proceed, the full pledge amount will be refunded to the donor.
- Q Is it to late to pledge now or make a donation to support Baycliff's dredging?

If you notice suspicious activity, please call the police! For a crime in progress or activities of concern, **please call 911 immediately**. Your quick actions may save you or a neighbor from being victimized. If you discover you are a victim of crime, but an immediate response is not indicated, please call the police as soon as possible at **385-5000, Option #1**. This is the Virginia Beach Emergency Communication Center, and you will speak to a dispatcher. It is very important that you file the brief crime report, as this allows the police to determine patterns of crime in our area, is the basis for additional patrol cars being sent out to prevent future incidents, and is a requirement for property loss insurance claims.

Once you have spoken to the police, notify Neighborhood Watch Coordinator Sharon Haring at **481-5508 or contact her at SMHaring@aol.com** so she can broadcast a Baycliffwatch message throughout the neighborhood so residents can be proactive and prevent further incidents.



BAYCLIFF SADDENED BY THE LOSS OF ED DE LONG

LCDR Commander Edgar Emile DeLong, United States Navy, Retired, 86, passed away on July 16, 2015 surrounded by his family. Son of the late Ormond M. DeLong and Delta Simoneaux DeLong, Ed was born in New Orleans, Louisiana.



Demonstrating what was to become a life-long passion for travel and adventure, he ran away from home at age thirteen and joined the Russell Brothers Circus in Los Angeles, California, later enlisting in the U.S. Navy at the age of fifteen. He participated in the invasions of Iwo Jima and Okinawa during World War II, witnessed the Atomic-Bomb tests at Bikini Atoll, sailed with the U.S. Merchant Marine and was a veteran of the Korean and Vietnam wars. His final tour of duty was Director of the Naval Guided Missile School, Dam Neck, Virginia Beach.

Ed was a proud "Mustang" - an enlisted man who advances through the ranks - retiring as a Lieutenant Commander in 1969 after twenty six years of service. He then went on to successful careers in computers and insurance and earned a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from St. Leo College at the age of fifty two. Active in the Lions Club International, Ed was recently recognized as Lion of the Year by the Thalia Lions Club, where he directed their Bland Memorial Music Scholarship program for eleven years. He co-authored *Golden Slippers*, a musical play about the life of James Bland, composer of "Carry Me Back to Old Virginny," that was eventually produced by the theatre department at the University of Maryland, Eastern Shore. Ed was a member of the Old Dominion University Institute for Learning in Retirement and facilitator of the Virginia Beach Writers Association for more than twenty years, authoring numerous articles and winning several contests, including second place at the New York Mills, Minnesota-based Great American Think -Off 2012. An unabashed patriot, he delivered inspiring and well-received presentations about the history and importance of the U.S. flag to many civic, school and workplace organizations. Ed's autobiography, Navy Mustang, was published in 2008. It should also be noted that Ed served for many years as Baycliff's wonderful Santa Claus and brought much joy to the children and families of Baycliff.

Ed is survived by his devoted and loving wife of sixty two years, Ruth Bell DeLong, children Jan Wahl, Thomas DeLong (Barbara), Geri Starr (Bob) and grandchildren Matt Starr, Steven Wahl (Sara), Ashley Franchi (Chris), Thomas Wahl (Megan), Brooke Cline (Will) and Brandon DeLong. WHEN A SOLICITOR COMES TO YOUR DOOR...BUYER BEWARE!

The City of Virginia Beach has a law to help protect homeowners when solicitors come to the door. Solicitors must obtain and carry with them a police department-issued non-laminated plastic card displaying their photo and the name of the company they represent. The most common door-to-door solicitors are security alarm companies, home repair, and magazine subscription sales.

Most are legitimate companies and will have the proper solicitor permit displayed. Please do not invite solicitors into your home until you are convinced they have properly identified themselves. If the sales offer sounds too good to be true, trust your instincts; they are probably right. If you post a "no soliciting" sign, be sure to also include "**VIOLATORS WILL BE CHARGED WITH TRESPASSING.**" If an individual continues to solicit after seeing such a sign, he or she can be charged with trespassing, but the homeowner/resident would need to prosecute and appear in court.

Some solicitors, such as charitable, non-profit organizations and civic or religious organizations are exempt and do not require a solicitor's permit. However, those individuals are required to register with the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Affairs (VDACA). Such organizations can be verified online at www.vdacs.virginia.gov or by phone during business hours with the VDACA at (804) 786-1343.

Report all suspicious individuals to the Police non-emergency number 385-5000.






